Dear Parents and Guardians,

The new school year is nearly upon us and as we prepare for the 2018 - 2019 school year, we wanted to reach out and share our plan with our families.

The Saint Mary's Nursery School offers children an early educational experience embracing family, continuity and early development as a basis for learning. Children are nurtured and educated in a community classroom that includes children from 18 months to five years of age in the preschool program and from Kindergarten to 5<sup>th</sup> grade in our school age programs. The children benefit from skilled teachers, direct parent involvement, early intervention specialists and involved community members. The educational curriculum is carefully planned to be developmentally appropriate and based in play, with an emphasis on creativity and the arts to nurture the social-emotional health and the development of each child. Additionally, we are committed to the family environment and the consistency that generations of children enjoyed before they were placed into age groups and graduated classrooms. Our children enjoy a single and stable classroom. Consequently, we believe that the children are able to work on their own growth and change without the distraction of a shifting environment, much like a home. It is our experience that all of these elements create a homelike environment that allows children to relax and open up to all aspects of learning.

Our teaching philosophy is centered upon the child's individual needs. The arts are the cornerstone of our educational program. Our curriculum is very closely aligned with the principles of the Reggio Emilia philosophy, in which the themes and concepts that we communicate to our students are supported and documented through their creative products. Art projects, construction projects and theater performances, are individually catalogued, photographed and otherwise recorded to follow and document each child's development.

Thank you for sharing your family with ours. We are excited about the coming year and look forward to the collaboration of school and family that each year guarantees.

#### PRE-K PROGRAMMING

SMNS is so proud of its unique and sophisticated Pre-K program. We have worked hard to develop a program that honors our focus on the arts and process oriented learning while addressing the **Kindergarten readiness** needs of our children and families. The program offers a multitude of experiences and supports to help the children and the families' transition to a new school environment. SMNS students achieve **Kindergarten readiness** through three primary focus areas in our Pre-K programming:

- Academic Readiness. We work with the children to broaden the literacy skill building started in early years at SMNS. Pre-K students learn the alphabet with a primary focus on recognition, then written letters and letter sounds. Letter strings and reading may also be a part of the lessons as appropriate for the individual child's readiness. We also work with children on counting, simple addition and subtraction, measurement, comparison, shapes and scientific concepts. Kindergarten classroom etiquette is an important element of the Pre-K classroom times and we work with the children throughout the year so that each child arrives at Kindergarten ready to learn.
- The Arts and Self-Expression. Arts are central to the SMNS overarching learning program and the age exclusive environment of the Pre-K class allows the SMNS arts programming to culminate in three theater performances over the Pre-K year. The performances are developed from the ground up by the class with characters and lines, music, props and rehearsals. We also have a highly sophisticated visual arts focused curriculum. This program builds basic visual arts knowledge, collaboration and critical thinking skills which students carry with them into Kindergarten despite the reduction of visual arts programming in area public schools. Teacher Sara Karlen has been instrumental in the development of this part of our program.
- Citizenship. The Pre-K experience enhances fundamental SMNS lessons of citizenship by engaging students as not only members of a supportive community, but as leaders and agents responsible for creating and maintaining that community. The teaching staff works with Preschool through Pre-K students to create a forgiving, generous and absolutely loving environment that consistently demonstrates our priority of continually creating a community that is welcoming to all regardless of any perceived obstacle. Area teachers have shared that SMNS students arrive in their Kindergarten classrooms not just as students, but as positively contributing, socially sensitive citizens of a classroom community.

#### Pre-K Schedule Details.

9:00am: Children are dropped off in the Pre-K room. Early arrivals are brought to the Pre-K room

9:00am-10:00am: Centers, choice time and free play

10:00am-10:30am: Clean up, circle time, snack time

10:30am-12:00pm: Spilt Group Activities—specials, concentrated activities, or outside activities in split groups. Groups switch after 45 minutes (for the Fall we have Gymnastics on Monday and Wednesday and Yoga on Tuesdays; Thursdays and Fridays we might do explorations of students interests, dive into our monthly theme, take a nature walk or visit the library)

12:00pm-12:45pm: Lunch

12:45pm-1:30pm: Free play on the playground

1:30pm-2:00pm: At the start of the year this is an optional Pre-K adventure or continuation of morning projects of play (over the course of the year the afternoon session will be that all children join)

2:00pm-6:00pm: Aftercare; children take part on our mixed age programming and free play

#### SCHOOL AGE PROGRAM- AUGUST 27, 2018 THROUGH JUNE 6, 2019

The SMNS After School Program is designed for school age children from Kindergarten through the fourth grade. We continue the holistic mixed- age play environment and creative free exploration inspired by the Reggio Emilia approach that children experience in their SMNS preschool years, while offering students increased ability to construct and lead activities appropriate to their older developmental stage. We provide healthy snack, homework help, arts instruction and student-driven free play including gross motor movement each day from 3-6pm. The After School students go on field trips to the University City Arts League (Spruce Street across from Penn Alexander), as well as to the library, local cultural institutions and Penn Campus.

The After School children are separated from the early education classrooms. Their play is significantly different and they need the time and space to work on their own cognitive, emotional and physical development; however they also have the chance to mentor and guide younger students on specific activities. The program offers a wonderful opportunity for families with mixed age children to continue their children's care at SMNS and continue the strong relationships they have built with SMNS' exemplary staff as they progress through school. At the same time the program offers new elementary school students the chance to become part of the welcoming SMNS community.

#### **Transportation:**

**SMNS** teachers pick up After School children from the following school: Greenfield Elementary, Lea School, Penn Alexander School (PAS), Independence Charter School (Center City), Powel Elementary School on all public school days and early dismissal days.

Arrangement for after school pick up must be made directly with the SMNS administration.

#### **SUMMER CAMP:**

The SMNS Summer Camp Program for School Age children (rising 1st graders though rising 6th graders) begins in July 1 of each year and ends the Wednesday prior to Labor Day.

Building from our Preschool Program SMNS now offers a unique Summer Camp Program to school aged children. Our curriculum is put into practice through various field trips where children explore new environments and gain a deeper understanding of familiar ones. The focus is to provide an engaging array of opportunities primarily centered around several geographical regions and topic areas: Museums, Sustainable Agriculture, Center City, West Philadelphia and Environment / Ecology. The Summer Camp contributes to the creative and investigative learning process that has begun in the individual child. While children enjoy the best of what summer has to offer in the Philadelphia region, they continue to practice necessary principles of respect and community, as well as adopting a larger role of responsibility in the wider world. These emerging practices of citizenship are necessary tools as the child continues to grow.

We always like to remind our community that the tuition charged does not cover the actual expense of education; consequently, the Saint Mary's Nursery School relies on grants and community donors to bridge the gap between the tuition charged and the cost of providing a high quality early education experience.

#### Other possible fees

CoOp families may be charged \$15 per hour for missed parent help commitment. Total charge for missed parent help cannot exceed \$120/month.

Early drop off or late pick up charge for child(ren)'s attendance outside of contracted times: for pick up after 6pm a fee of \$10 for the first 5 minutes. After 5 minutes, \$2 per minute thereafter plus additional \$50 charge.

\$50 may be charged to a family that does not participate in the quarterly Saturday Work-Day.

#### Tuition Details/Discounts

- 1. Enrollment is for the ENTIRE Academic Year. Early Withdrawal between September 1,2018 through June 30, 2019 will be charged 50% of your deposit. No portion of tuition will be refunded on account of absences. One month of tuition deposit is required to confirm the enrollment.
- 2. Enrollment must be 5 days per week.
- 3. The activity fee is non-refundable and charged once in the academic year and once for the summer program to cover the cost of special events, special instructors, activities and field trips.
- 4. Sibling discount: First Child 100% tuition. Second Child: 15% for Full Day enrollment, 10% for Half Day enrollment. Third Child: 10% Full Day or Half Day
- 5. CoOp discount: for half day enrollment the maximum amount of coop discount is \$60, for 4 hours of coop per month. For full day enrollment the maximum amount of coop discount is \$120, for 8 hours of coop help per month.
- 6. Parent Student Scholarship Discount: \$45 monthly scholarship discount for families with parents enrolled in degree and/or training program.
- 7. Half day: 9am-1pm or 1pm-5pm, you may add extra one or two hours on it, fee applies
- 8. Full day: 9am-4pm, you may add extra one or two hours on it, fee applies
- 9. Extended Day: 7:30am-6pm
- 10. 1% discount of tuition for Quarterly Billing
